



## II/ Doctrines of Hinduism and Buddhism

#### A. Revelation

#### i. Hinduism

- > the four Vedas ("knowledge) (c. 1500-1000 BC), the earliest texts
- > the Brahmanas (c. 900-500 BC), consisting mainly of rituals and mantras
- > the Upanishads (c. 800-500 BC), 108 philosophical treatises
- > the Dharmashastras (c. 100 BC-200 AD), ethical, cival, and criminal law
- the Brahma Sutras (c. 100 AD), 550 verses of cryptic descriptions on God, reality, salvation, and other matters
- > the Ramayana (c. 500 BC) and the Mahabharata (c. 400 BC-300 AD), epic poems
- > the Puranas (c. 400-1000 AD), containing the "history of the universe"
- ➤ the Tantras (c. 300-1100 AD), containing magical/occult rituals and spiritual exercises to accelerate enlightenment

#### ii. Buddhism

- > The **Tripitaka** ("three baskets")
  - 1. the Vinaya Pitaka ("basket of discipline"), a code of ethics for monks and nuns
  - the Sutra Pitaka ("basket of threads"), accounts of the Buddha's teachings
  - 3. the Abhidharma Pitaka ("basket of scholasticism"), philosophical works

#### B. God

"The centerpiece of New Age spirituality is individual self-fulfillment and empowerment. It is actually a kind of anti-soteriology (salvation). As a matter of fact, it is the very quintessence of every kind of works-religion, because if New Age spirituality is correct, *I'm* the one I have to please; *I'm* the only one who can chart my own spiritual journey. *I'm* the one whose standards I have to live up to.
