#### **CONFRONTATIONAL KING**

- 5 In your own words, why did Jesus clear the moneychangers from the temple (hint: remember Adam's illustration with Sashi)?
- Adam said that God sends "grace quakes" to shake us up draw us closer to himself. What "grace quakes" has God recently brought into your life?

### CHILDREN OF THE KING

- 7 Why was Jesus' love for children revolutionary?
- 8 Read 1 Corinthians 1:27-28 and 2 Corinthians 12:9. In your own words, what does it mean to "boast in weakness"?
- 9 Adam said, "Everything we are called to be and do as Christians requires weakness. It is the song of the gospel in the mouths of the weak that makes them overcomers." Why do you think we are so averse to being weak? How does the gospel make weak people strong?
