Jonah: The Redirected Life

Jonah 3:1-10 Ray Cortese, February 2 & 3, 2019

Step 1: Reflect on the Text

- 7 Who is on the throne of your life? Have you ever said, "I'm a follower of Jesus, but not when it comes to..."?
- 8 Do you typically direct more outrage toward others or toward yourself? Why does the gospel free you to admit that you are the one most in need of God's grace?
- 9 How did God's forgiveness of the Ninevites relate to Jesus?
