



Trusting God With Who He Says I Am

Warm-Up Question:

How does the relationship between living to please God and living knowing God is pleased with you work? Which one goes first and what happens if you reverse it?

READ: Colossians 1:1-14

I. I AM SAINT and II. I AM FAITHFUL (v. 2)

- ▶ How does it make you feel to be called a "saint" (holy one)? Do you believe it?
- ▶ How does your "faithfulness" affect your being set apart by God as a "saint"?

III. I AM IN CHRIST (v. 2)

If you are united to Christ, name some things Christ has that you also have now "in Him." Eph. 1:3 & Jn 17:21-23 are worth reading slowly to ponder this question.

IV. I AM QUALIFIED (v. 12)

- The word here means "enough, able, competent." In what ways have you felt disqualified as a Christian?
- What has Christ qualified you for (v. 12)? How are you made qualified for it (refer to other "I AM's)?

V. I AM DELIVERED & VI. TRANSFERRED (v.13)

What are you "delivered" from and "transferred" to? How did that happen and what is the result?

VII. I AM REDEEMED & VIII. FORGIVEN (v. 14)

- If the ransom price for your life was the blood of the Son of God, what does this say about the seriousness of your sin?
- Read Psalm 32:1-2 & 103:10-12. To what extent are your sins forgiven?
