READ: COLOSSIANS 1:15-23

I. THE PREEMINENCE OF CHRIST

- What is glorious about Jesus:
 - 1. being the image of God (15), with the fullness of God dwelling in him (19)?
 - 2. creating all things in heaven and earth (16) and holds all things together (17)?

- What does it mean to be reconciled and how did it happen (vs. 20, 22)?
- Do you believe you are presently being presented holy, blameless, and above reproach before God (22)?

III. THE PERSEVERANCE OF FAITH

- ▶ What is required of us in vs. 23?
- ▶ How can you practically "continue in the faith" and "the hope of the gospel"?
