

A CULTURE OF GOSPEL: Mission

<u>Warm-Up Question</u>: If you were writing your own personal mission statement, what key words would you include?

READ: John 13:37-38; Matthew 4:23; Revelation 21:5; 1 Corinthians 15:58

I. MISSION: GET MENDED

- Read John 13:37-38. Why do you think Jesus pushed back against Peter's bold claims? What do you think went through Peter's mind when Jesus predicted his denials?
- When have you sensed God holding you back from ministry? What growth or maturity did you develop during that time that you later realized you needed?
- ► How did Peter's brokenness affect his ability to be on mission? How have you found Jesus when you came to the end of yourself, like Peter? How does your mending affect your ability to be a mender?

II. MISSION: MEND THE WORLD

- ► If the Gospel is our mission, we need to define "Gospel." What is the Gospel according to Matt. 4:23, 1 Cor. 15:1–8, 2 Tim. 2:8, 1 Peter 3:18, and 1 John 4:10?
- Whose little light has shined on your life and helped you see Jesus? Who are you letting your light shine on today? Who will you invite to church on Easter?
- Read Mark 8:35. What do you have to lose, or give away, that will help mend the world? Discuss skills, experiences, gifts, hobbies, talents, etc. that can be used in the kingdom of God.

III. MISSION: MENDING IN VAIN

- ▶ Read Rev. 21:5 and 1 Cor. 15:58. What is the key to labor that is not in vain?
- ► How does the quote in the sidebar help you reframe a frustrating situation?
- Read Psalm 96:13. If you knew Jesus was coming tomorrow, what would you do today?

What is one main take-away you want to apply in your life this week?
