### **Warm-Up Question:**

Read the quote in the sidebar and discuss whether or not you agree.

**READ: Luke 4:1-13**

### **I. TEMPTATION: WILL THE FATHER PROVIDE?**

- ▶ From v. 2-4, what does the devil first tempt Jesus with and how might you relate with such temptation if you were there?
- ▶ Under the temptation to satisfy hunger was to doubt God's provision. In what area of life have you been tempted to distrust that God would provide for you?
- ▶ Read Rom. 8:28 and Psalm 37:8-10 and discuss how such promises help battle the temptation to doubt God's provision for you?

### **II. TEMPTATION: WILL YOU WORSHIP THE FATHER?**

- ▶ From v. 5-8, what does the devil next tempt Jesus with and how did it threaten his relationship with God the Father?
- ▶ In what ways are you tempted to 1) pursue your own glory, 2) to build your own kingdom, or 3) to love things in the world too much?

### **III. TEMPTATION: IS THE FATHER WITH YOU?**

- ▶ From v. 9-12, what does the devil lastly tempt Jesus with and how did it threaten his relationship with God the Father?
- ▶ Have you ever had a season of suffering that tempted you to doubt God was with you? If so, describe.
- ▶ Read from Heb. 2 & 4 in the sidebar and discuss what Jesus did and how it applies to you and your temptation. Why's it matter that he overcame his?
- ▶ Do you believe 1 Cor. 10:13? What do you think our responsibilities are in regard to our temptations & where do you personally think you need to grow?
