The Gospel of Luke: Meeting Our Savior

Warm-Up Question:

How do people with authority and power tend to use their authority and power?

READ: Luke 7:1-17

- Put yourself in the place of the Centurion and mother in these two stories. How would you be feeling, and what would you be hoping for?
- ▶ From v. 4-5, what was their argument as to why Jesus should help him? How does that view of God often make sense in the world's view? Have you ever thought this way, especially when suffering?
- What was different about the Centurion's view of Jesus and himself (v. 6-8)? Compare it with John the Baptist's view of both from John 1:26-30.
- How do you see the extent of Jesus's <u>goodness</u> from these two stories? Discuss the extent of his <u>authority and power</u>?
- ▶ From these stories and v. 10, 16-17, give a good definition for "faith." How does faith relate to the authority and goodness of Jesus, especially in uncertainties of life?

Application:

- Are there any areas of your life where you struggle to believe in God's ultimate authority and goodness in your life?
- What is one area where you need to lean more into trusting God's goodness? What about in his power? How do you think you would live differently if you really rested in God in this way?
- What is the most beautiful thing about Jesus you saw today? How do you want that to impact you?

What is one main take-away you want to apply in your life this week?

<u>Question(s) for Prayer Time:</u>

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Scripture Passages Used:

Luke 7:1 After he had finished all his sayings in the hearing of the people, he entered Capernaum. 2 Now a centurion had a servant who was sick and at the point of death, who was highly valued by him. 3 When the centurion heard about Jesus, he sent to him elders of the Jews, asking him to come and heal his servant. 4 And when they came to Jesus, they pleaded with him earnestly, saying, "He is worthy to have you do this for him, 5 for he loves our nation, and he is the one who built us our synagogue." 6 And Jesus went with them. When he was not far from the house, the centurion sent friends, saying to him, "Lord, do not trouble yourself, for I am not worthy to have you come under my roof. 7 Therefore I did not presume to come to you. But say the word, and let my servant be healed. 8 For I too am a man set under authority, with soldiers under me: and I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it." 9 When Jesus heard these things, he marveled at him, and turning to the crowd that followed him, said, "I tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith." 10 And when those who had been sent returned to the house, they found the servant well.

Luke 7:11 Soon afterward he went to a town called Nain, and his disciples and a great crowd went with him. 12 As he drew near to the gate of the town, behold, a man who had died was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow, and a considerable crowd from the town was with her. 13 And when the Lord saw her, he had compassion on her and said to her, "Do not weep." 14 Then he came up and touched the bier, and the bearers stood still. And he said, "Young man, I say to you, arise." 15 And the dead man sat up and began to speak, and Jesus gave him to his mother. 16 Fear seized them all, and they glorified God, saying, "A great prophet has arisen among us!" and "God has visited his people!" 17 And this report about him spread through the whole of Judea and all the surrounding country.

John 1:26 John answered them, "I baptize with water, but among you stands one you do not know, 27 even he who comes after me, the strap of whose sandal I am not worthy to untie." 28 These things took place in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

John 1:29 The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world! **30** This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks before me, because he was before me.'
