#### **Warm-Up Question:**

If people who know you well were asked what the purpose of your life is, what would they say?

**READ: Luke 10:1-24** 

#### I. THE MISSION: SENT

- ▶ If Jesus sent out 72 non-apostles (v. 1), what does that say about every other non-apostle's calling by Jesus? How does Matt. 28:18-20 confirm this?
- What does v. 2 refer to as one thing we are "sent out" to do and what does it mean? How can you, your family and Life Group do this?
- What does v. 9-10 say about what we are to do on mission? (Discuss also out Seven Rivers mission statement in the sidebar)
- Who are some people around you that are spiritually broken and need healing? How might God use you to bring the healing love of Jesus to them?

- What does v. 3 say about being sent out on mission by Jesus? What might that look like here in Citrus Co.? What ways do you ever feel anything like this?
- V. 21 says the gospel is hidden from some. V. 24 says many don't see and hear. From v. 21-22, why do some see and hear it?

- What do you think made the 72 so joyful after they returned (v. 19-20)? What does Jesus tell them to rejoice in?

### **Scripture Passages Used:**

Luke 10:1 After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to go. 2 And he said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. 3 Go your way; behold, I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. 4 Carry no moneybag, no knapsack, no sandals, and greet no one on the road. 5 Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house!' 6 And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him. But if not, it will return to you. 7 And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the laborer deserves his wages. Do not go from house to house. 8 Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you. 9 Heal the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' 10 But whenever you enter a town and they do not receive you, go into its streets and say, 11 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet we wipe off against you. Nevertheless know this, that the kingdom of God has come near.' 12 I tell you, it will be more bearable on that day for Sodom than for that town.

**Luke 10:13** "Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago, sitting in sackcloth and ashes. **14** But it will be more bearable in the judgment for Tyre and Sidon than for you. **15** And you, Capernaum, will you be exalted to heaven? You shall be brought down to Hades.

**Luke 10:16** "The one who hears you hears me, and the one who rejects you rejects me, and the one who rejects me rejects him who sent me."

Luke 10:17 The seventy-two returned with joy, saying, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us in your name!" 18 And he said to them, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. 19 Behold, I have given you authority to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall hurt you. 20 Nevertheless, do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."

**Luke 10:21** In that same hour he rejoiced in the Holy Spirit and said, "I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that you have hidden these things from the wise and understanding and revealed them to little children; yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. **22** All things have been handed over to me by my Father, and no one knows who the Son is except the Father, or who the Father is except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him."

Luke 10:23 Then turning to the disciples he said privately, "Blessed are the eyes that see what you see!
24 For I tell you that many prophets and kings desired to see what you see, and did not see it, and to hear what you hear, and did not hear it."

Matt. 18:13 And if he finds it, truly, I say to you, he rejoices over it more than over the ninety-nine that never went astray.

**Heb. 12:2** looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

**John 15:11** These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.
