Warm-Up Question:

Have you read any books by CS Lewis? If so, which is your favorite?

Start by Reading: 1 Corinthians 13:13

I. Mere Christianity: FAITH

- If one were to walk the road of all out moral effort, what would be the probably end of that road? Read the 1st quote to the right to help you think through this.
- ▶ What would it look like for you to try really hard to go 6 weeks without being impatient, defensive, critical, or to say anything that's not useful to encourage.
- What does Romans 3:9-12, 20 teach us about one of the purposes of the law? How should the law lead us to faith in Christ?

II. Mere Christianity: HOPE

- Discuss what Romans 8:22-23 teaches us about living in this world. How does it give understanding of your experience?
- Read the long quote in the sidebar and discuss 1) how you can relate to it, and
 2) how it should impact and change how we live.
- Read Psalm 16:11. What do you think it means? How would this impact how you live more if you really believed this and lived in light of it?

III. Mere Christianity: LOVE

- Read Eph. 4:32. What does it call you to do? What if you don't feel such love or kindness for people?
- Read the bottom quote to the right and discuss. How does what we do actually form us into who we become?
- Read Eph. 1:4-5 and Romans 5:6-8, 10. When did God set us love on us? How did what God did for us demonstrate his love for us?

"If I find in myself a desire which no experience in this world can satisfy, the most probable explanation is that I was made for another world.
