The Story of the Bible

SEVEN RIVERS

This study has several aims in mind:

- 1. To give you an overview of the Bible
- 2. To lead you to trust the authority of God's Word in your life
- 3. To help you see how the Bible is all one story of God's grace through Jesus
- 4. To give you more desire to read, study, and know God through his Word

The structure is as follows:

Week 1: What's the Bible All About?

Week 2: The Bible is a Story

Week 3: The Bible is a Story of God's Grace Through "Covenants"

Week 4: The Bible is a Story of God's Grace Through Jesus Week 5: The Bible is a Missional Story That Ends in Glory

This is meant to be used in a small group, which means there are 3 different sections:



Read God's Word, along with some articles and watching videos, in order to be discuss and grow in your knowledge of God and his Word.



Knowledge is always meant to be applied to our life. Discuss how what we learned can equip us to to better live it out in daily life.



Spend time responding to God with what you've learned about his Word. Praise him, thank him, and ask him for help understanding it all the more.



Read the following verses slowly. Pause at times to speak to God as you read.

Eph. 2:1 As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, **2** in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient. **3** All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our sinful nature and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature objects of wrath. **4** But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, **5** made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. **6** And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, **7** in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. **8** For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—**9** not by works, so that no one can boast. **10** For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.


Week 3: THE BIBLE IS A STORY OF GOD'S GRACE THROUGH COVENANTS



Read the following verses slowly. Pause at times to speak to God as you read.

Romans 5:6-9 You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him! For if, when we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life!


Ephesians 1:3 Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ. 4 For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. Read the following verses slowly. Pause at times to speak to God as you read.

Rev. 21:1 Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. 2 And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. 3 And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. 4 He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away." 5 And he who was seated on the throne said, "Behold, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true." 6 And he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give from the spring of the water of life without payment.... 22 And I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. 23 And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and its lamp is the Lamb.

A Few Tips:

- Read it first in the morning ("Scripture before phone")
- Listen to it if learn better by hearing (play button at bottom of screen)
- Pause to ask questions or ponder something as you read:
 - What does it mean?
 - What does it say about God, humanity, sin, grace)
 - How is God calling me to respond?
- End with prayer (over a verse or something that impacted you)
